Each member of the family supports and loves each other. Kinship relationships are vital for the raising and teaching of many Aboriginal children and it is because of the love they receive from extended members of their families that they can understand deep connection and love.

Born on Wiradjuri Land in Wagga Wagga, Amanda is an exceptionally passionate and talented Aboriginal artist who has been creating breathtaking original artworks from her studio under the moniker ‘Because of my Four’ for many years now.
