

Kathleen Buzzacott is an artist, poet, designer and entrepreneur, of Pitjantjatjara Scottish and English heritage, born in Alice Springs Central Australia. Kathleen's fine Central Desert Dot Painting style celebrates her discovery and connection to her indigenous heritage.

Strong symbolism in this artwork is 'family'. A vital part of Aboriginal culture is storytelling, family sitting around campfires out bush telling stories, the passing of knowledge to the next generations.

Creation stories provide important information about culture, values, people, animals and the environment, and are passed down from generation to generation through storytelling. The tradition of passing information through art is a universal. Symbols are used in art to preserve the culture and tradition.
