

Assembly Guide

Thank you for choosing Bindi Wheelie Bin Enclosures, Australian owned and manufactured. Please find below a list of simple steps demonstrating how to effectively use your storage unit. Whether you are enclosing your wheelie bins or storing items around the home or garden you will need a flat surface so your enclosure can be easily opened and closed.

Locking Caps

These caps are located on the top of your enclosure and ensure the unit stays rigid when closed. There are two angle caps for each corner and a middle cap for the centre of the unit.



Accessing Bins

Your storage unit will allow easy access to remove the general rubbish, garden waste or recyclable wheelie bins at anytime. Each Bindi enclosure consists of four panels, which are individually hinged so panels can be Bi folded on either side to access what you are storing.



Removing Bins

Once you have removed the bins that need to be put out for collection, simply fold panels back to its original configuration and ensure the middle capping and corner caps are locked back into position.



Latching your enclosure - (Optional)

Tools required: Cordless drill, Phillips drill bit. If securing to into brick or masonry a 7mm drill bit is required to drill hole, wall plugs, and screws are provided.

Most often our customers use their wheelie bin enclosure as a free-standing unit, however we also provide the option to latch your enclosure to your fence or wall. Within your pack we have provided two cabin hook latches & fixings. Simply attach the latches as seen below to the top of each side panel ensuring the correct distance from to the wall/fence you are fixing to.
